DIRECTIONS:

-Approaching from Colchester or Bury St Edmunds follow the A14 over the Orwell Bridge then take the 2nd left onto the A12 towards Lowestoft. Crossover 5 roundabouts and at the 6th (by Wyevale Garden Centre) turn right and continue down to the T-junction. Turn right and Woodbridge School is 200yds on left.

-Approaching from Lowestoft on the A12 crossover the roundabout that has Melton signed on the left. Pass the Shell garage and at the next roundabout turn left. Continue down to the T-junction. Turn right and Woodbridge School is 200yds on the left.

-Once you get to the school follow signs to the Sports Dome/Seckford Theatre. Car parking is available as you arrive at the School, or near the Sports Dome. Please do not park on the grass.

WOODBIDGE JUNIOR OPEN 2018

This event is now celebrating its 18th consecutive year.

Woodbridge School is well established as one of the focal points for junior chess in Suffolk, and is an accredited ECF (English Chess Federation) centre of excellence. International Master Adam Hunt is employed full-time to teach chess at the School, running a vast array of clubs, lessons and activities. The school has produced three England internationals and former student and chess scholar Justin Tan from Australia has recently become a Grandmaster.

LONDON JUNIOR QUALIFYING

The London Junior Chess Championships (LJCC) is one of the most prestigious junior tournaments in the country. Scores of 4/6 are required to reach the Under 8 (U8) final, whilst 4.5/6 is needed for U10 and U12 major qualification. Minor finals of U10 and U12 sections require 3.5/6. No qualifying score is needed for U14, U16 or U18 sections

ELIGIBILITY

Entrants must play in their own age group unless given permission from the organiser. This is based on their age at 31 August 2018. So a 9 year old on this date would play in the Under 10 section.

RATE OF PLAY

30 minutes per player per game. Clocks will be used on all boards. The games will be ECF rapidplay graded.
